

Classic Dinghy Regatta

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

06 and 07 March 2021

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024.
- 1.2 The Rules will also apply to the Social Sail, particularly regarding safety requirements, where appropriate.
- 1.3 Trailerable boats will comply with AYF Special Regulations Part 1. Off the beach boats must comply with AYF Special Regulations Part 2.

2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

- 2.1 Notices to competitors will be posted at the Lake Bonney Yacht Club [LBYC] Foyer Notice Board above to the Sign On/Off sheets.
- 2.2 It is a prerequisite that all competitors in the regatta conducted by the LBYC wear an approved personal floatation device (PFD).

3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Any change to sailing instructions will be posted before 10:00 am on the day it will take effect.

4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed from the LBYC.
- 4.2 When flag AP is displayed ashore, "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 15 minutes" in the race signal AP.
- 4.3 When code flag Y is displayed ashore, rule 40 applies at all times while afloat. (Refer SI 2.2)

5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.1 Dates and Times of Racing – as detailed in the Notice of Regatta.

6. **INTENTION TO START** (Regatta Races & Social Sails)

6.1 All competitors intending to start are required to nominate on the "Sign On" form located at notice board in the LBYC foyer. Failure to sign on as specified may render the participant a non-competitor by the race committee.

7. <u>DIVISION FLAGS</u>

7.1 It is intended that there will be one race start but the Race Officer will decide if the number and diversity of boats warrants multiple starts. Where required multipul starts will be discussed at pre race briefing.

8. RACE AREA

8.1 Races will be conducted on Lake Bonney.

9. COURSES

9.1 The Courses are to be a triangle windward-leeward course depending on where the Marks are placed. Courses will be displayed on the course board at the briefing prior to the start of the race. Instructions written on the course board will form part of and may modify these instructions.

10. MARKS

10.1 Marks used in programmed races may consist of:

White pencil mark displaying orange flag (Start)
White pencil mark displaying Blue flag (Finish)
200 litre drum painted (Painted black/yellow chequered)
Red inflatable buoy;
Fixed 200 litre drum (painted as Minion)
Race Management boat displaying Race management flags.

- 10.2 The starting line will be a buoy and Boat described in 10.1 designated by the Race Officer at the briefing prior to the start of the race.
- 10.3 The finishing line will be a buoy and boat described in 10.1 designated by the Race Officer at the briefing prior to the start of the race.

THE START

- 11.1 Races will be started in accordance with rule 26 with the warning signal given five (5) minutes before the starting signal.
- For multiple divisions, the Warning Signal for each subsequent division will be the start 11.2 signal of the previous division.
- The starting line will be between the flagstaff on the Race management vessel and a mark 11.3 specified in SI 10.1
 - A barging buoy may be moored from the committee vessel. All yachts shall leave this buoy on the same hand as the committee vessel when starting. The buoy is deemed to form part of the committee vessel it protects, and any yacht touching the buoy, or passing between it and the committee vessel shall be deemed to have touched the committee vessel and shall exonerate herself in accordance with rule 31
- Boats for who the warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. 11.4
- 11.5 A boat starting later than 10 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start.

12.1 The finish line will be between a mark described in 10.1 and flagstaff on the committee vessel. RRS rule 32 also applies. All yachts that has finished shall keep clear of the finishing

13. **PENALTY SYSTEM**

- Rules 44.1 and 44.2 apply. 13.1
- 13.2 the protest committee may, without hearing, penalize a boat that has broken rule 42.
- 13.3 Appendix P will apply (as changed by instruction 13.2).

14. **TIME LIMITS**

- 14.1 The time limit to complete the course will be one hour thirty minutes.
- 14.2 If no boat has passed the first mark within 30 minutes after the divisional flag signal the race will be abandoned for that division.
- 14.3 Boats failing to finish within thirty minutes of the first boat in each division, or after the time limit expires, whichever is the later, will be scored a Did Not Finish. This changes rule 35 and A4.

PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS 15.

- 15.1 Protest forms are available from the LBYC. Protests shall be delivered there within the protest time limit.
- For each division, the protest time limit is sixty (60) minutes after the last boat of the division of which the protesting boat is a member, has finished the last race of the day. 15.2 The same protest time applies to all protests by the Race Committee and Protest Committee about incidents they observe in the racing area and to requests for redress.
- Notices will be posted within thirty (30) minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be 15.3 held in the LBYC as soon as practicable after the last race of the day.
- 15.4 Notices of protests by the Race Committee or Protest Committee will be posted on the Notice Board to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).

16.

- <u>SCORING</u>
 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply. 16.1
- The Classic Wooden Dinghy Regatta consists of a Social Sail and Regatta Race on Saturday and 16.2 Social Sail and Regatta Race on the Sunday. The results will be calculated after the Sunday race.

17. SAFETY REGULATIONS

- For safety purposes all competitors shall sign off on the "Sign off" form in LBYC foyer within 60 minutes of the last boat finishing Race 2. Boats that fail to do so may be scored a Did Not Finish.
- 17.2 A competitor that retires from a race shall sign "Retirement" form and notify the Race Result Recorder, located in the LBYC as soon as possible of their retirement.

18. REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- Substitution of competitors will not be allowed unless signed permission from Race Officer and displayed on notice board in foyer.
- In the event that a competitor changes his/her boat, the points scored for the replaced boat will not be transferred to the replacement boat.

19. OFFICIAL BOATS

Official boats will be the LBYC Race management boat and or other boats nominated at the briefing by the Race Officer. A Media and Photography Boat may, will be able to move within the fleet of racing boats.

20. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

20.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

21. <u>INSURANCE</u>

21.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1 million for the regatta.
